

By-Name Registry List Fact Sheet

What is a By-Name Registry List?

A registry list is a tool used to help communities assess, document, and prioritize people experiencing homelessness based on their level of need using the Vulnerability Index Service Prioritization Assessment Tool (VI-SPDAT). A registry list provides the necessary information to calculate a monthly housing placement target – the number of individuals each Coordinated Access Network must house per month to meet the goals of Zero: 2016 and end chronic homelessness by the end of 2016.

Why Create a By-Name Registry List?

Registry lists are a best practice to prioritize and serve those experiencing homelessness
U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) mandated that HUD Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) units be prioritized for those experiencing chronic homelessness
CT Department of Housing requires that new PSH units be prioritized for those experiencing chronic homelessness
ow Do I Create a By-Name Registry List? create a by-name registry list, your Coordinated Access Network (CAN) should:
Survey and document everyone entering the homelessness system using the VI-SPDAT. This includes individuals, families, and youth over age 18 whether or not they are document ready.
Establish one database , rather than a static list, allowing every relevant agency to access real-time by-name list information
Use one Release of Information allowing all relevant agencies access to the list
 Engage in comprehensive street outreach that systematically covers the entire CAN, including 100% of outreach hot spots, including: List of CAN hot spots (i.e., soup kitchen, library, food pantry, bus station) Delineation about which parts of the CAN are covered by which agency Timeline for outreach to find new clients
Hold regular CAN-wide case conferences
 Operate under documented by-name list policies and procedures, including: Procedures for adding people to the by-name list, including: How often people are added and who adds people to the list Procedures for removing people from the by-name list, including:

People who have been housed or are no longer homeless

People who have not been identified after a certain length of time
