Changes in 2017

- We started the PIT process earlier than ever: July of 2016 for a count in January
- Thorough process of identifying unsheltered canvasing areas
- RFP issued for new unsheltered methodology
- Mobile tech use expanded





2017 Youth Count

- Intensive work with YETI (Youth Engagement Team Initiatives) around the state
- Process done in conjunction with the 2017 PIT – numbers informed the counts going to HUD
- Week long process
- New mobile app developed at no charge by Microsoft








PIT - Total Population












Chronic Homelessness





- Lowest PIT Count ever in Connecticut
- 13% decrease since last year
- Chronic Homelessness down 60% since 2014
- Lowest veteran number in Connecticut
- 4,396 homeless or unstably housed youth identified through the Youth Count process
- Unsheltered population decreased 38%
