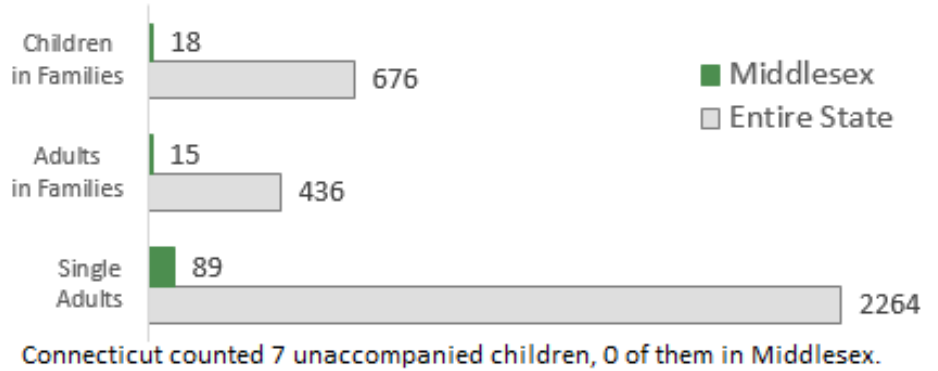


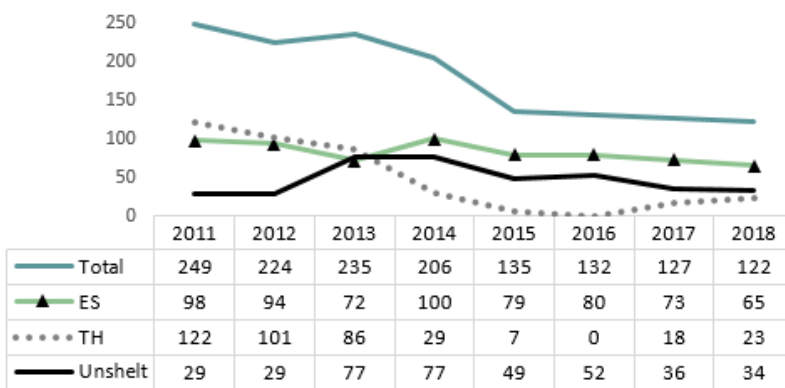

People Experiencing Homelessness: Sheltered and Unsheltered

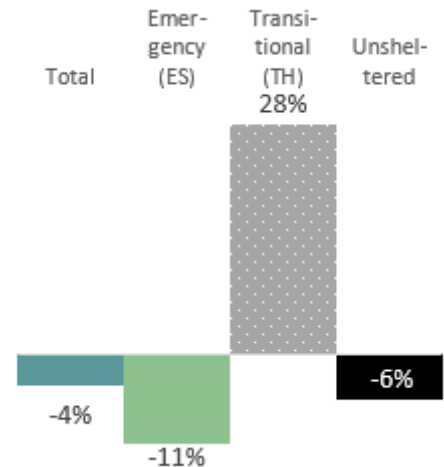
On the night of January 23, Middlesex counted **122** people experiencing homelessness, **18** of them children



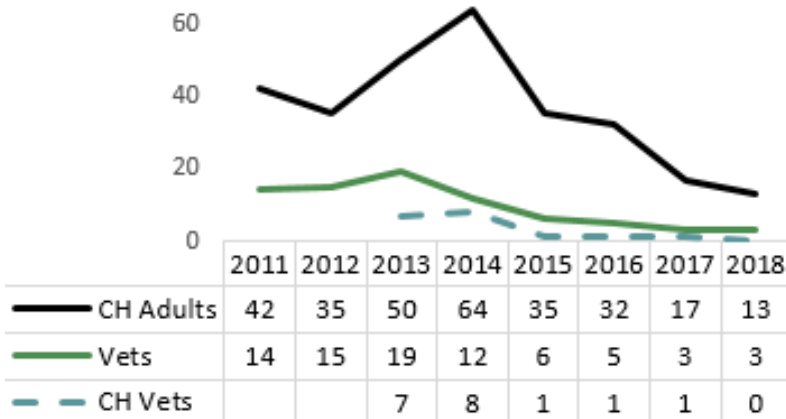
Changes in Middlesex PIT Numbers

Chronicity and Veteran Status



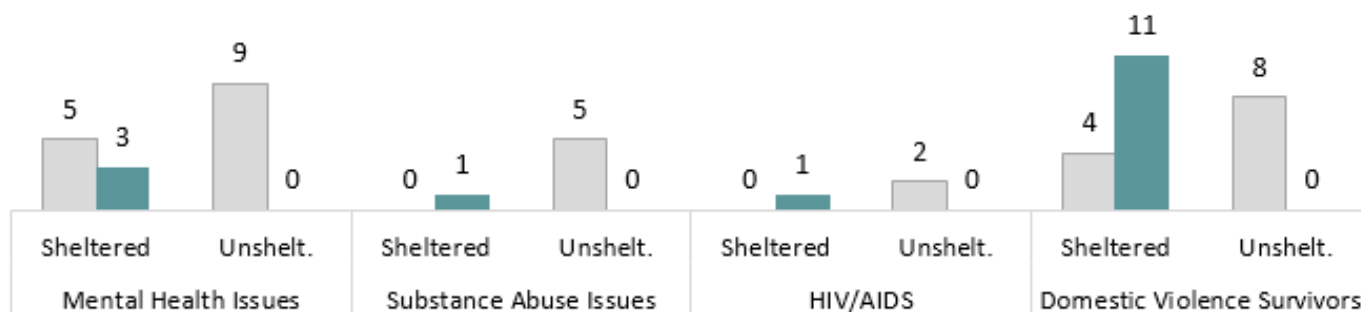
2018 CT Youth Count!
 Youth are significantly under-counted in the Point-in-Time Count. A Youth Count was held separate from, but in conjunction with, the PIT Count. An estimated **5,054** youth under age 25 reported being homeless or unstably housed on the night of January 23 in Connecticut.

Health and Safety

CT PIT collects data on a number of common service needs that are shared by a large proportion of individuals facing homelessness. By using this information about health and safety needs, more targeted interventions that allow a focus on well-being in addition to housing can be developed.

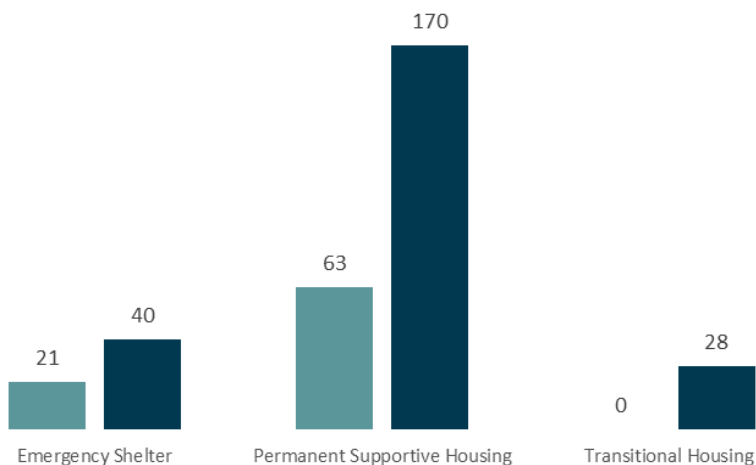
Homeless Adults in Middlesex with Health or Safety Issues
