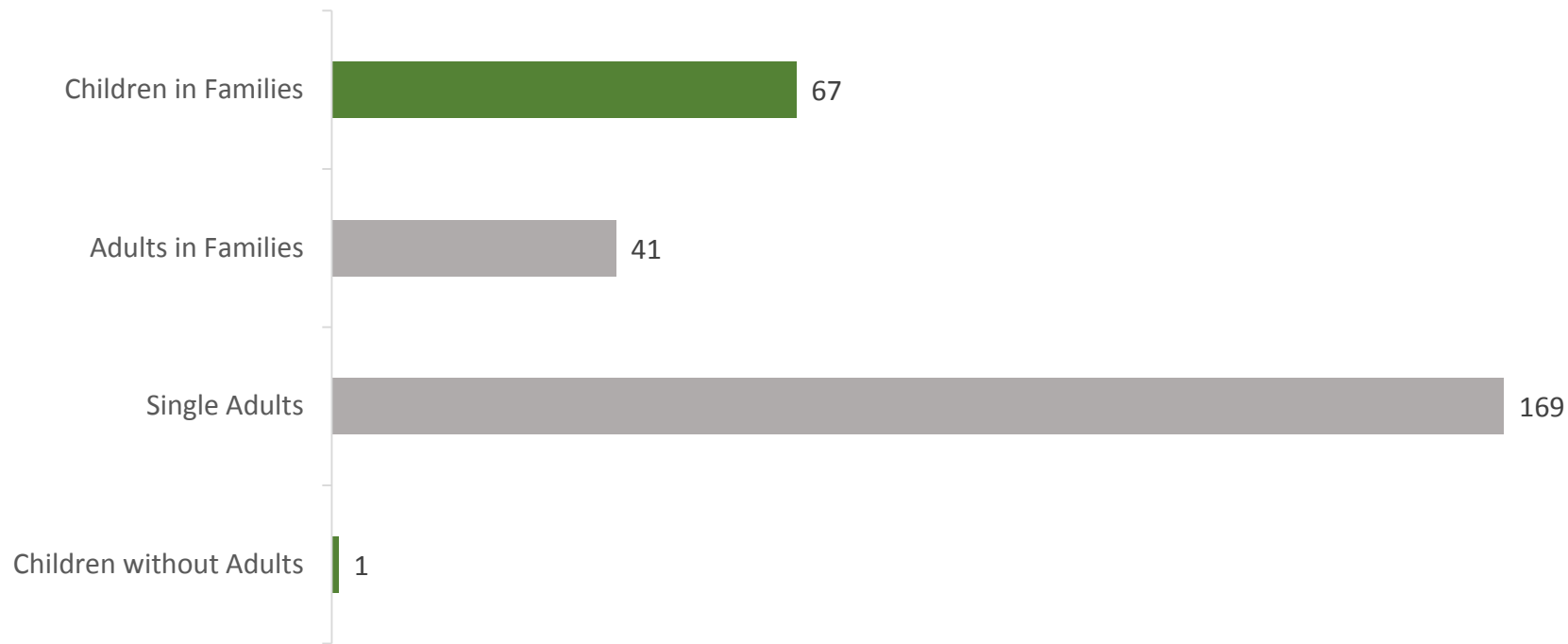


CT Point-in-Time Count 2019 Bridgeport Summary

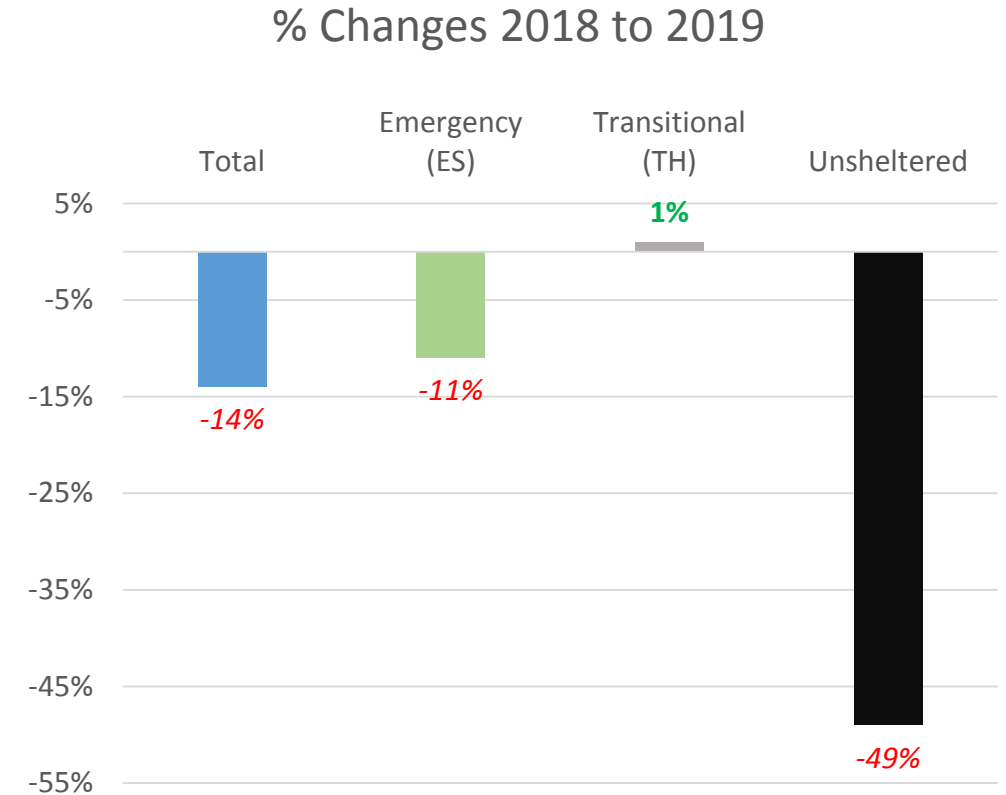
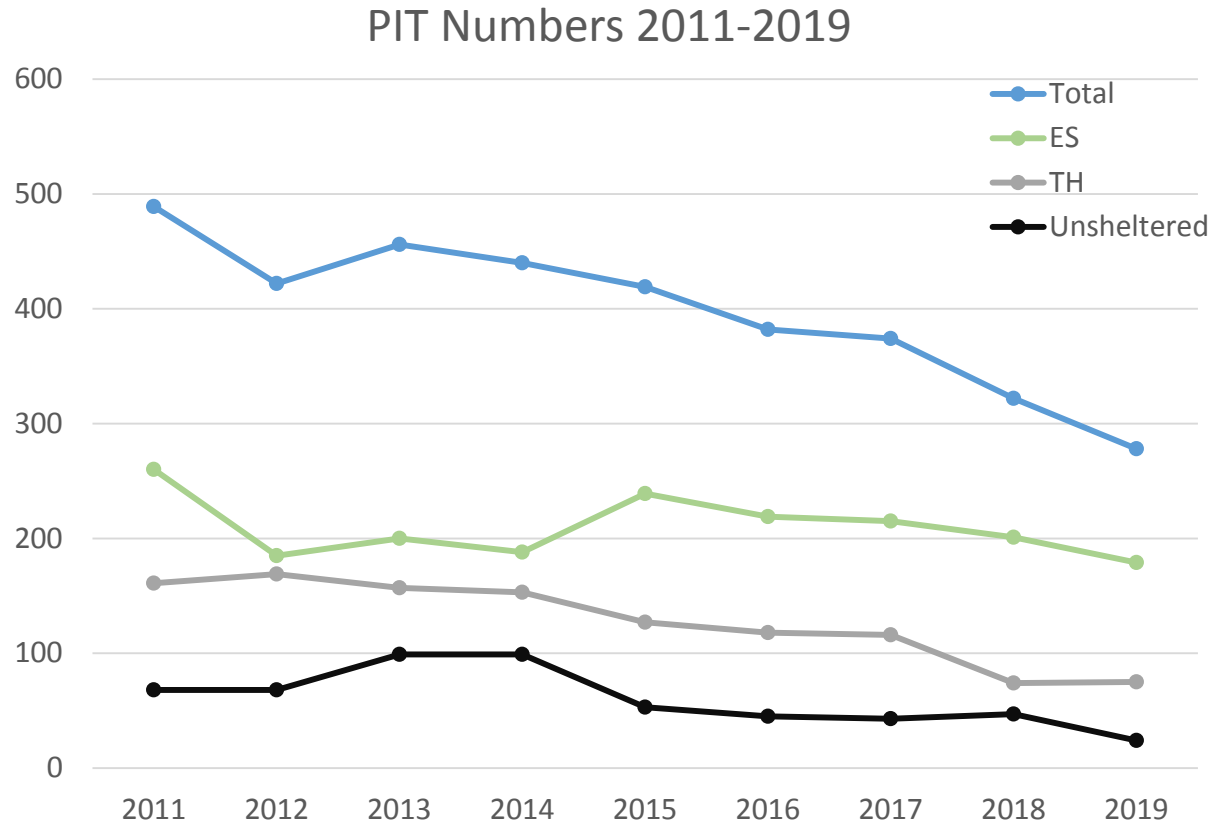


People Experiencing Homelessness: Sheltered & Unsheltered

- On the night of January 22nd, 2019, Bridgeport counted **278** people experiencing homelessness, **68** of them children.

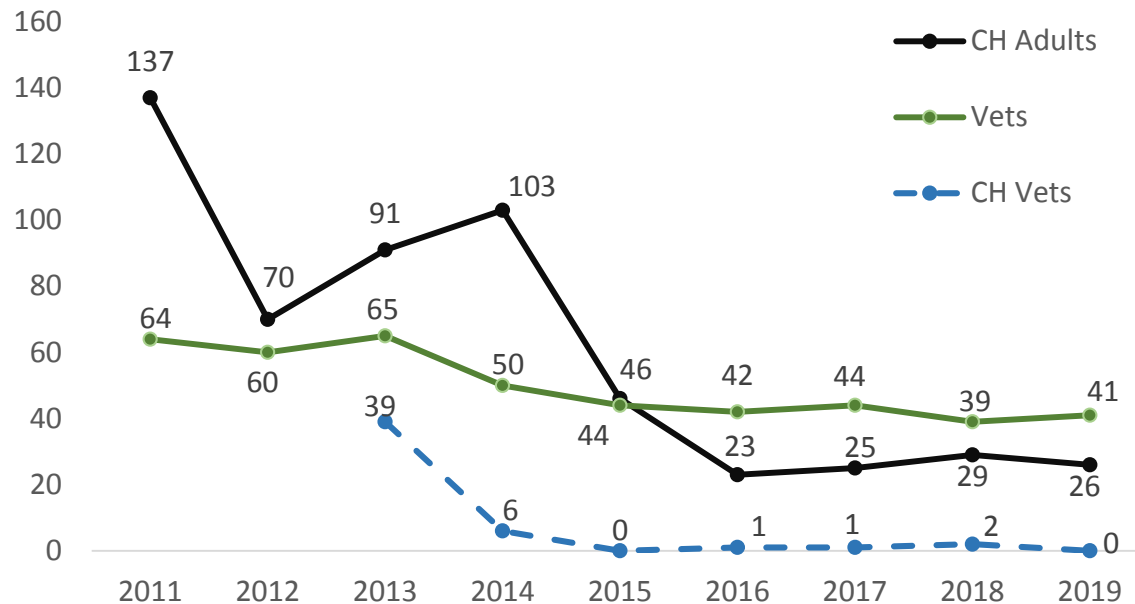


Changes in Bridgeport PIT Numbers

Chronicity and Veteran Status

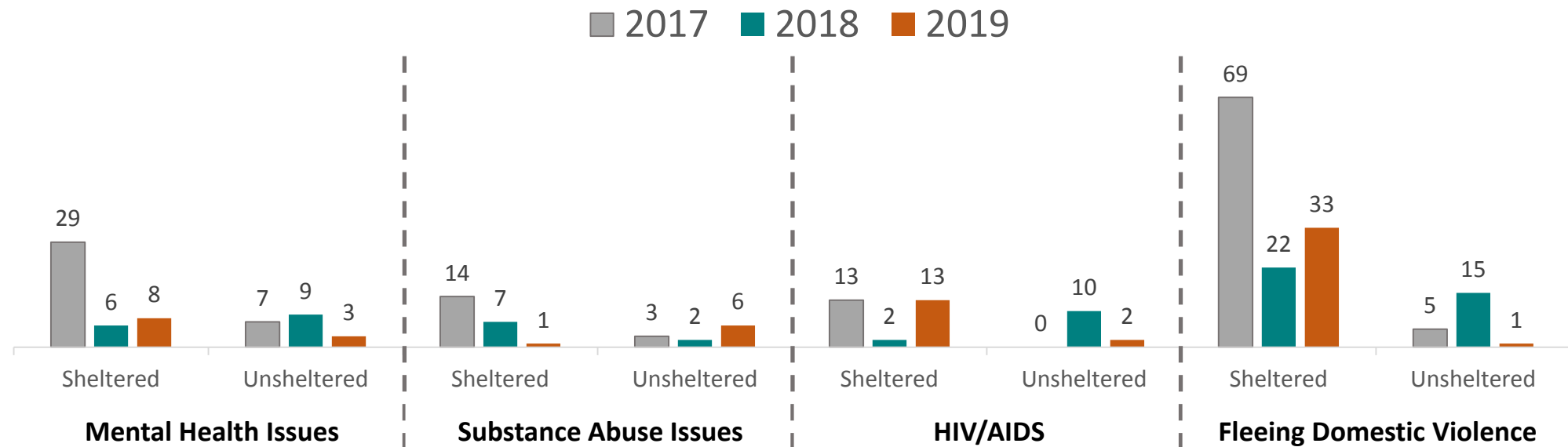


2019 Connecticut Youth Outreach & Count

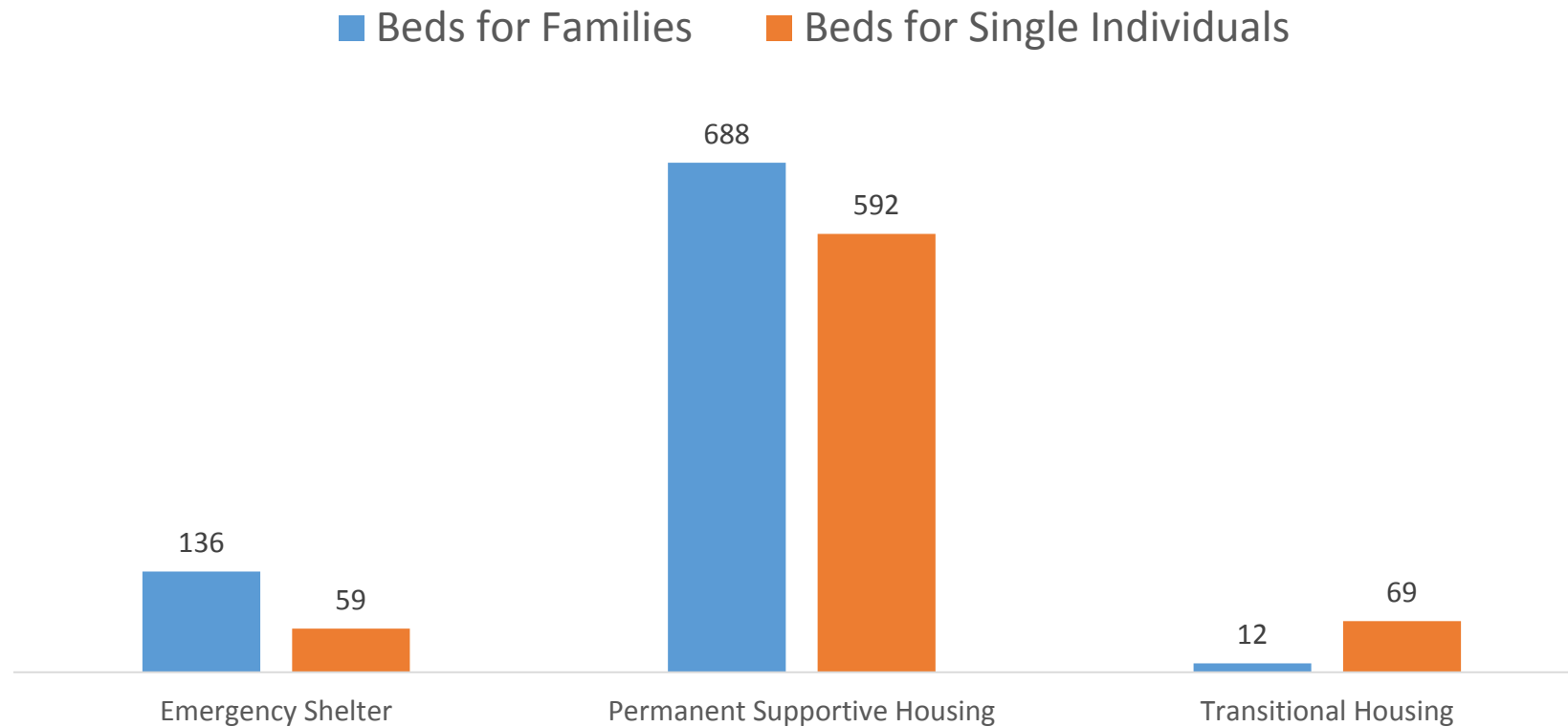
Youth are significantly under-counted in the Point-in-Time Count. The Youth Outreach & Count was held separate from, but in conjunction with, the PIT Count. An estimated **9,303** youth under age 25 reported experiencing homelessness of being unstably housed the night of January 22nd 2019 **stateside across Connecticut.**

Homeless Adults with Health or Safety Issues

- CT PIT collects data on a number of common service needs that are shared by a large proportion of individuals facing homelessness.
- By using this information about health and safety needs, more targeted interventions allow a focus on well-being in addition to housing can be developed.
