## **Dashboard Alerts for Disabling Conditions**

#### September 2, 2021

#### What are the changes?

Beginning 9/2/21 users will see three new dashboard alerts. Alerts will show when disabling condition data in a client's HUD Universal assessment At Entry conflicts with data in their HUD Program assessment At Entry or if certain disabling condition data is missing from the HUD Program assessment At Entry. These alerts will only show for clients within programs where the HUD standard data elements are collected. Users will only see alerts for programs in organizations they have access to.

#### The alerts are:

- "Chronic Homeless Conflicting Data in Program"
  - This alert will display if the client has "Yes" to disabling condition in their HUD universal At Entry assessment but all disabling conditions are set to "No" in the program assessment.
- "Chronic Homeless Missing Data in Program"
  - This alert will display if disabling condition questions or sub-questions in a client's HUD Program assessment at entry are blank (null).
- "Chronic Homeless Data HIV/AIDS Missing in Program"
  - This alert will display if the HIV/AIDS disabling condition drop down in a client's HUD Program assessment At Entry is blank (null).

For example: if a client's HUD Universal assessment At Entry indicates they have a disabling condition but none of the disabling conditions are marked "yes" on their HUD program assessment an alert will show.



To <u>clear</u> the alerts users should confirm the accuracy of the data in the client's At Entry assessments and complete or update information as needed, following their standard process. Once the data is complete or no longer conflicts alerts will clear in 24 hours.

#### How does this help?

Because disabling condition information is critical for program eligibility and for accurately calculating a client's chronic homeless status, these alerts will allow users to see where data issues may be so they can take action to correct them.

### When will I see this change in HMIS?

This change is expected to be rolled out on September 2, 2021.
