The 2023 Legislative Session is underway, and early indications suggest that addressing the housing crisis and the rising number of homeless in our state will be front and center. This is our moment, and we are off to a strong start!

Over the past several weeks, Sarah Fox and I have been meeting with legislative leaders in both houses, and every legislator on both sides of the aisle now has our **CT CAN End Homelessness 2023 Legislative Agenda** in their hands.

Our Legislative Agenda for 2023 requests that the state budget annually include reliable and appropriate funding in four vital areas:

- to address chronic underfunding of providers and staff wages;
- to annualize funding for Coordinated Access Network (CAN) infrastructure:
- to annualize desperately needed cold weather funding;
- and to create a flexible funding pool to bridge the gaps in available services.
