ANNUALIZED COLD WEATHER EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROGRAM



To address the cold weather humanitarian crisis now and in the future, we need ongoing, consistent funding to ensure that every year, every person has a roof over their head.

To address the cold weather crisis now and in the future, we need ongoing, consistent funding to ensure that every year, every person has a roof over their head. To keep people from freezing outside, Connecticut must invest **\$5M** to be added annually to the DOH Housing/Homeless Services line item.

Cold weather shelter offers a warm, safe place to stay for those who are outdoors in the coldest part of the year.

As of January 15th, there were over 800 people sleeping outdoors, with many turned away due to lack of capacity in shelters and warming centers. There simply is not enough space or staff to care for people who are unsheltered.¹

Connecticut's homeless response providers need an ongoing and permanent source of funding to provide enough beds to keep people from freezing outside, while having the correct staff-to-client ratio to safely manage shelters.

People experiencing homelessness face a significantly higher risk of developing exposure-related conditions like hypothermia and frostbite. These conditions are immediately life-threatening and can also increase the risk of dying from related conditions in the future

For the 2024 winter, no funds have been committed by the state. Committed funding would allow providers to secure staffing and locations in advance for this critical life-saving service.

Budget Request: \$5 Million to be added annually to the DOH Housing/Homeless Services line item

- Diverts those seeking shelter during extreme cold weather from emergency rooms and public buildings, saving lives and public dollars.
