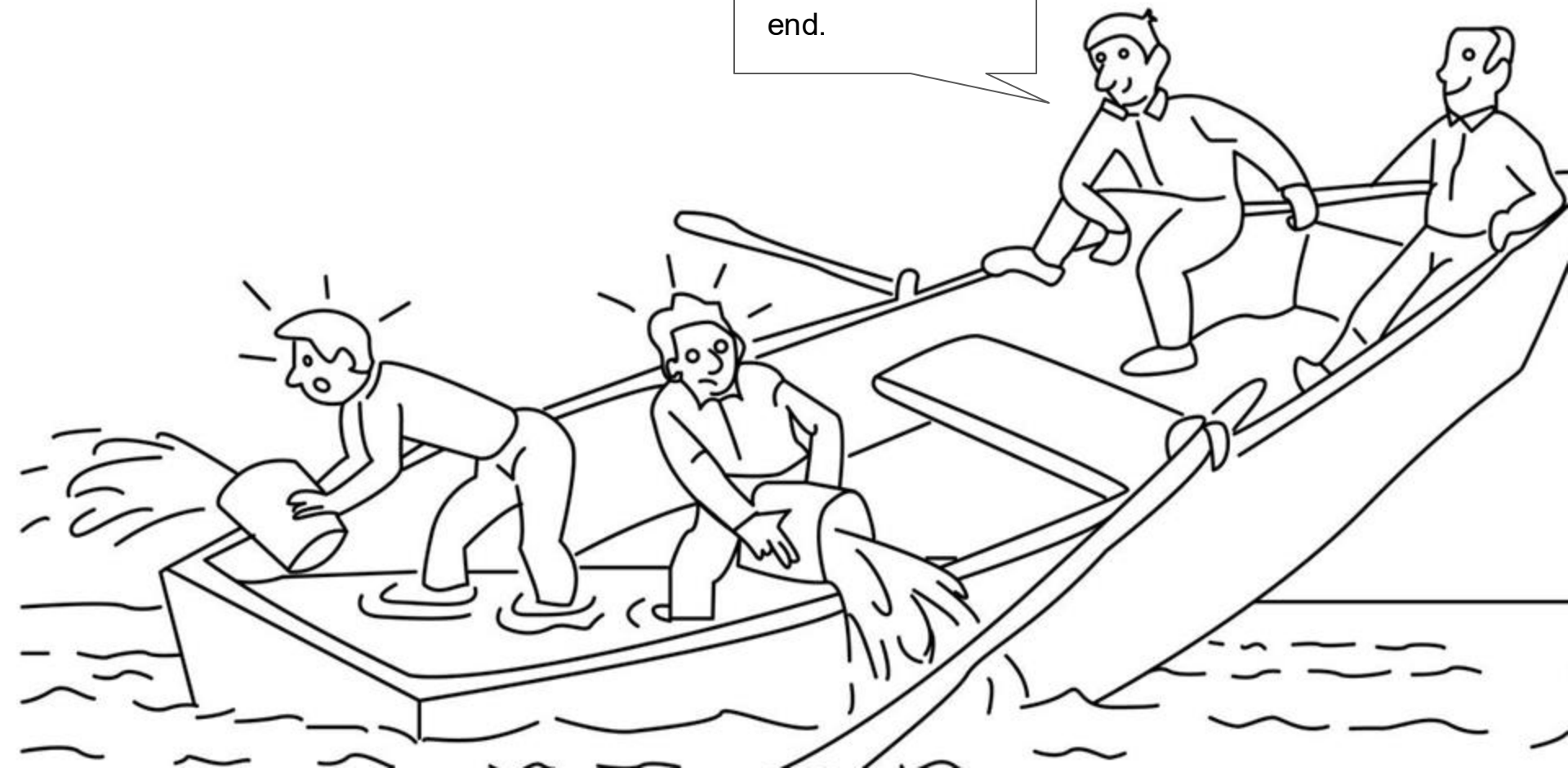
RE!NSTITUTE

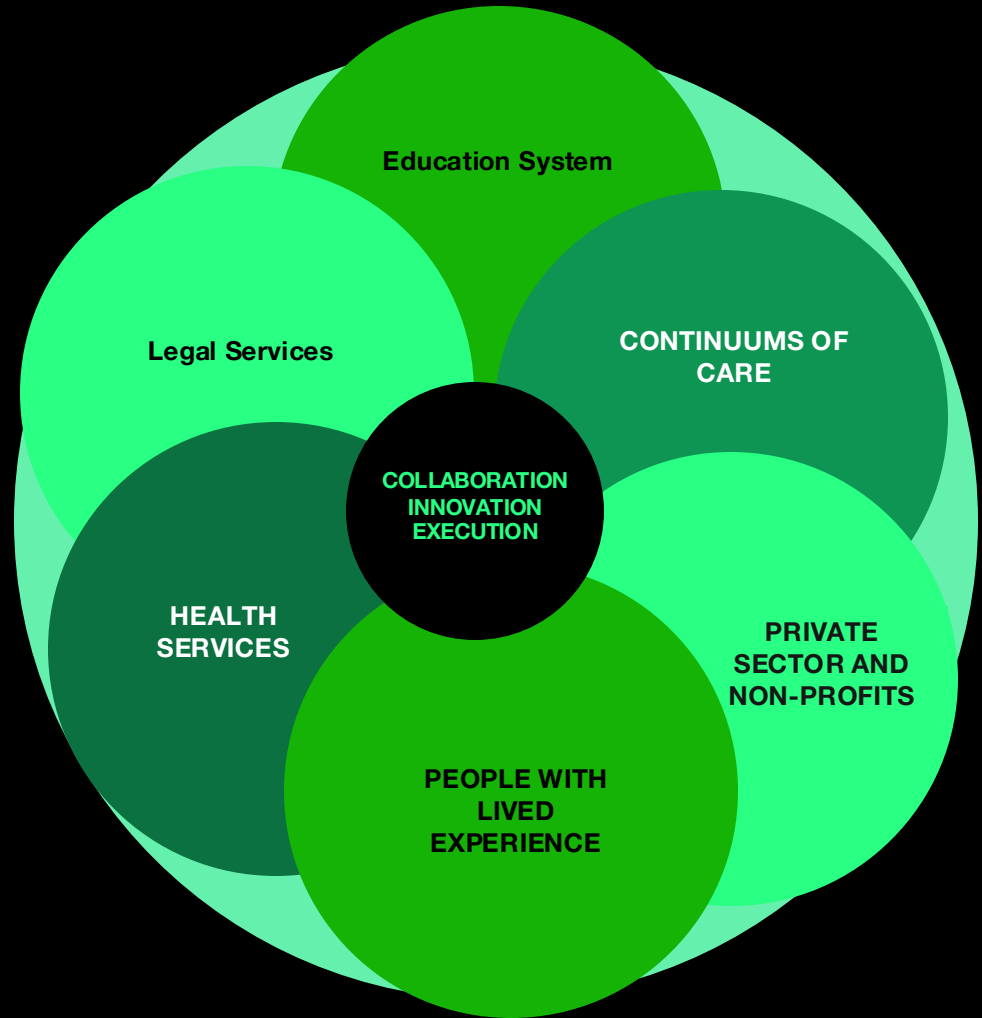

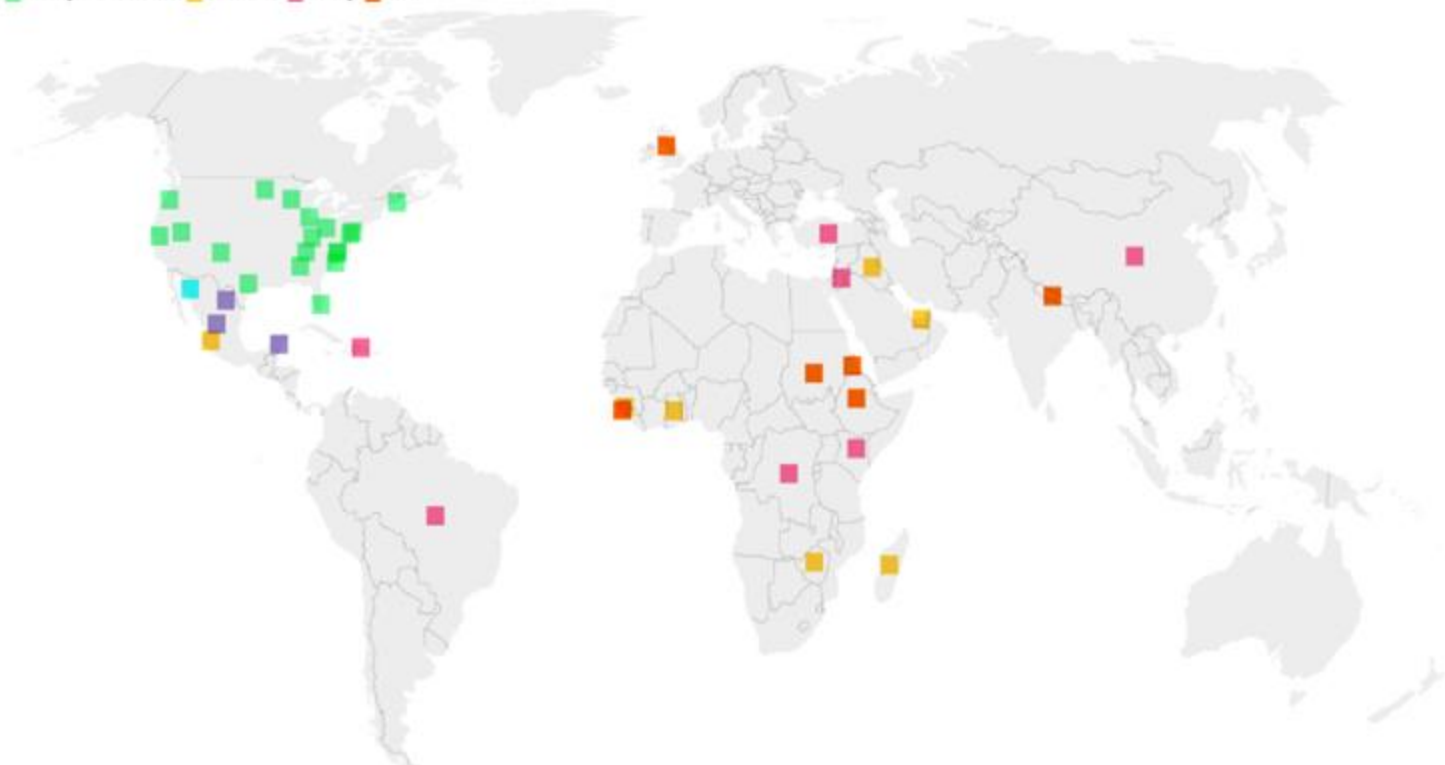

Goal	Results
<p>In Sacramento County, in 100 days:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● In 100 Days we will house 200 youth and young adults (YYA) ages 16-24 in safe, stable housing with connections to supports, of which 20% are pregnant and/or parenting and 65% are experiencing stress or mental health symptoms that create challenges to becoming stably housed. 	<p>As of Day 100:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 266 YYA were safe and stably housed. ● 100% of YYA who were housed have been connected to support. ● 41% of YYA who were housed are pregnant or parenting. ● 56% of YYA who were housed are experiencing stress and/or mental health symptoms as a barrier.
